 The instant petition has been filed by Sh. Randhir Singh, father of Sh. Anurag Singh, under Section 142 of the Electricity Act, 2003 against M/s BSES Yamuna Power Ltd. for violation of certain provisions of Delhi Electricity Supply Code & Performance Standards Regulations, 2007. 2.
