INTERIM ORDER

(Date of Hearing: 25.01.2018) (Date of Order: 30.01.2018)

- The instant petition has been filed by Shri Heera Lal under Section 142 of the Electricity Act, 2003 against BSES Yamuna Power Ltd. for violation of the procedure regarding booking of theft case as laid down in Regulations of the Delhi Electricity Regulatory Supply Code and Performance Standards Regulations, 2007.
- 2. The matter was heard on 25.01.2018. The Counsel for the Petitioner submitted that his consumption is more than 100% of the assessed units of energy. The Counsel for the Respondent rebutted the claim of the Petitioner and

submitted that as per inspection report the meter was slow by 75% and after

change of meter the recorded consumption per month is more than the

period before change of meter.

3. As per the Regulation, the Discom has to analyse the consumption pattern

on two grounds. Firstly if the consumption pattern for the last one year is

reasonably uniform and secondly it is not less than 75% of the Assessed

consumption.

4. The Respondent is directed to submit within two weeks a detail analysis of

actual consumption and assessed consumption for the period of one year

before the date of inspection and also the consumption pattern after the

change of meter.

5. The Matter was adjourned. The next date of hearing shall be intimated to the

parties in due course.

6. Ordered accordingly.
