ORDER

1. This Petition is filed by the Petitioner to direct the Respondent to install the electricity meter in the premises of the Petitioner bearing No. C-98/34, Gali No.14/1, Chauhan Banger, Delhi-110053. Other reliefs are also sought.
2. It is the case of the Petitioner that it had approached the learned CGRF whereby, learned CGRF vide its order dated 03.10.2024 passed the following order:

"Complaint is allowed. OP is directed to install the meter in the applied premises as per request of the complainant vide order no. 8006841072. In case there is any hindrance on behalf of any of the neighbours in installing the same OP shall adopt all coercive measures as allowed as per law and shall ensure the installation.

This Order shall be complied with within 21 days of the receipt of the certified copy or from the date it is uploaded on the Website of the Forum; whichever is earlier.

The parties are hereby informed that the instant Order is appealable by the Consumer before the Ombudsman within 30 days of the receipt of the Order.

If the Orders are not appealed against within the stipulated time or no interim stay thereon has been granted by the Ombudsman, the same shall be deemed to have attained finality.

Any contravention of these Orders is punishable under Section 142 of the Electricity Act 2003."

3. Learned counsel for the Petitioner states that despite the above order passed long back, the Respondent has failed to take appropriate steps to install the meter in question.
4. Mr. Manish Srivastava, Advocate enters appearance on behalf of the Respondent. He states that the neighbours are not permitting compliance of the order of learned CGRF and hence, the Respondent has not been able to take appropriate steps.
5. In our opinion, the order of learned CGRF was quite clear. The Respondent was directed to install the meter in question, as per request of the Petitioner. Further, in case of hindrances on behalf of the neighbours in installing the meter, the Respondent was permitted to adopt coercive measure as per law to ensure the installation.
6. The Respondent will ensure compliance of the order of learned CGRF dated 03.10.2024. Police Station, Jaffrabad, which we are told is the concerned police station, will provide necessary security to the officers of the Respondent to ensure installation of the meter and compliance of the order of the learned CGRF.
7. The Petitioner will render all necessary cooperation to the Respondent in this regard.
8. With the above directions, the present Petition stands disposed of.
