ORDER

(Date of Hearing: 09.08.2012)
(Date of Order: 17.08.2012)

1. M/s Knowledge Infrastructure System Pvt. Ltd. through this Petition has applied for Grant of Intra-State Trading License.
2. The Petitioner submitted that Central Electricity Regulatory Commission has already granted an Inter-state License to undertake trading of electricity. The Petitioner has made purchase of electricity for resale to utilities in other States after grant of License for Inter-State trading.
3. The Commission heard the Petitioner at some length and directed them to submit a copy of Inter-state trading license granted by CERC and complete details of their trading activities after issue of Inter-state trading license along with detailed information regarding technical requirements to qualify as an electricity trader, capital adequacy and credit worthiness to the Commission. The Petitioner placed the requisite information before the Commission.
4. The Petition was listed for hearing on 05.07.2012 and on the request of the Petitioner matter was adjourned and rescheduled for hearing on 09.08.2012. None appeared for the Petitioner on 09.08.2012.
5. The Commission has perused the Petition, the relevant provisions of the Act, Rules and Regulations and entire record placed before it. Rule 9 of the Electricity Rules 2005 provides that:-

“A licence issued by the Central Commission under section 14 read with Clause (e) of sub-section (1) of section 79 of the Act to an electricity trader for inter-state operations shall also entitle such electricity trader to undertake purchase of electricity from a seller in a State and resell such electricity to a buyer in the same State, without the need to take a separate licence for intra-state trading from the State Commission of such State.”

6. In view of above, the Commission is of the view that the Petitioner has an Inter-state License for inter-state trading which also permits the Petitioner to carryout business of trading within States; therefore there is no need to obtain a separate intra-state license for trading in the NCT of Delhi.
7. Accordingly this Petition is dismissed.
