ORDER

- 1. Mr. Amit Kapur, Ld. Counsel for BYPL submitted that in order to fulfill its universal service obligations and to supply reliable power in accordance with its obligation under the Delhi Electricity Supply Code & Performance Standards Regulations, 2007, BYPL entered into a long term power purchase agreement with Tato Hydro Power Limited for supply of electricity for an aggregate contracted capacity of 210MW Power. The Power purchase agreement is for a period of 35 years. Tato Hydro Power Limited is a 100% subsidiary of Reliance Power Limited a group company/related party defined under Accounting Standard ASIS.
- 2. Mr. Kapur further submitted that being an inter-state sale of power the tariff for this plant would be determined by Central Electricity Regulatory Commission once the PPA is approved by the Commission.

- 3. Mr. Kapur requested the Commission to admit the present Petition and approve the said PPA between BYPL and Tato Hydro Power Limited for supply of electricity for an aggregate contracted capacity of 210MW power for a period of 35 years.
- 4. Commission heard the arguments of Mr. Kapur at some length. The Commission admits the Petition.
- 5. The matter is listed for further hearing on 26.04.2012
- 6. Ordered Accordingly.
